Jesus Film/ Tanzania

The Jesus film continues to reach the lost in remote areas of Tanzania. Reports from May indicate showings in Rukwa, Manyara, Dodoma, Malinyi Morogoro, Same, Geita, Njombe, Mbinga Songea, and Muheza Mkinga with a total 78 souls saved with approximately 1000 attending. Another film kit was purchased this month to broaden the film's reach.



Ministry support / Tanzania

Daniel Mwakikunga has been a translator in the Tanzania outreaches and a good friend over the past decade. He was also a roommate of Bishop Mulenga years ago when they attended Bible college. He is very gifted evangelist and pastor and speaks at universities, plants churches in remote areas (see below), and Pastors his home church near Dodoma. He needed better video equipment to make his material available online. WCO sent funds to allow the purchase of a Nikon camera, Samsung tablet, tripod stand, and wireless microphone. His ministry continues to grow.

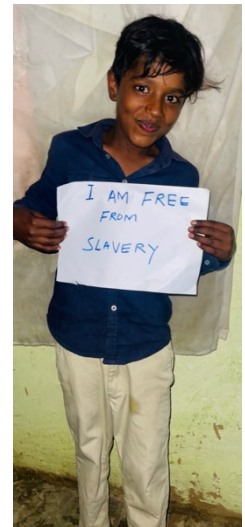
The ministry of our brother in Christ continues to reach the lost in Pakistan. Outreach involves both sharing and caring. Here is a note from our Brother;

Greetings in His name,

I am so excited that by the grace of God we have paid all the debt of brother Liaqat and family and also gave them their monthly support. We met with the cashier of the Brickyard and they showed us all his debt and we paid it all. Now we will do some paperwork with the owner and administration, and also we have requested they let them stay in their servant quarters for couple of weeks. We are all trying our best to find any job for brother Liaqat and trying to find a place for them to live too. Please keep them and us all in your prayers

Thank you so much for your love and financial support to set brother Liaqat and his family free from this miserable life of slavery. He is free now.

Ministry in India

Stan and Damaris continue to prepare for their extended trip to Kenya to complete the Ministry Center in Bahati. They will be heading over in July. We look forward to updates and a renewed effort at reaching the lost in Kenya. Pray for their safe travel and God's favor at opening ministry opportunities through the Ministry Center.

New Opportunities

We received this message from Bishop Mulenga;

This is Tabora Tanzania at our FPCT center where we take care of children and teach people with skin problems, albinos, some of them have strange eyes, some of them have different looks, their parents don't like them and they seem to be isolated. The church has taken this responsibility in the beginning of the construction of classrooms and the Swedish people helped us with the construction and the availability of equipment. And the government pays us for 4 teachers and the Church pays for 5 teachers, a total of 9 teachers. the Swedes withdrew aid. At the moment we have needs for the repair of toilets and beds and medicines to treat them. The cost is 35m tsh (\$15,000 US). There are many things in terms of needs, but this is very important for them, a large percentage of them come from very low-income families.



Our emphasis at WCO is reaching the lost with the gospel message. That said, we are also called to demonstrate our love with action. This is an opportunity to assist a partner church in their ministry to help these most disadvantaged children.
