World Christian Outreach works with indigenous pastors and evangelists to reach the lost, train Pastors, provide Bibles to believers, and to demonstrate God's love through caring for the needs of God's people in their countries. Members of the US team travel yearly to visit and participate in outreach efforts, but our partners are active all year long. Below we provide updates on some of these efforts.

Update on New Dawn School for Orphans in Kenya (ND-K).

New Dawn Kenya (ND-K) is a boarding school that provides food, shelter, clothing, and a first-rate Christian and academic education to orphans who could not otherwise attend secondary school. WCO created ND-K which has operated since 2006. For various reasons, the school was operating since 2022 without American assistance. This experiment was failing and in June of 2024 the Kariuki family running the facility made a desperate plea for help. WCO stepped in to take the financial and administrative actions required to support the children and restore the school to it original mission and hope. A new Kenyan leadership team was selected to oversee ND-K which includes four New Dawn graduates. The effort is being led by Boniface Mwangi who graduated from New Dawn in 2010 and later graduated from Dedan Kimathi University of Technology with a bachelor's degree in financial accounting.

In January of this year, I visited Kenya to assess our progress. Boniface, his wife Ann, and his son Alvin met me at the Bahati Guest home. This is the missionary guest house which Brother Stan Herpick worked so hard to bring into being. We met over several days with key people and discussed





the many challenges and issues related to restoring New Dawn to its original mission and success.

We then visited the school and had an encouraging and productive visit.

The school looked to be in good condition as a result of Boniface's restoration efforts the previous 6 months.

One of our objectives is to bring selfsustaining productivity from the farm. With Boniface in leadership, we think this is a real possibility. We toured the farm with the farm manager, Stephen, and saw the recent farming accomplishments and discussed what more we can do.

After I returned from Kenya, Pastor Anthony (our New Dawn spiritual development leader) and ND-K hosted a youth outreach called the "Weekend challenge" which brought hundreds



of students from 5 nearby schools. It was heartwarming to see this outreach bringing the message of the gospel and Biblical instruction. The following is an excerpt from their report (written by one of the students) and a few photos from the event.

THE WEEKEND CHALLENGE



The weekend challenge started on 6th March 2025. The theme was "WALKING IN OBEDIENCE "AS IN JAMES 1:22 "BE DOERS OF THE WORD AND NOT HEARERS ONLY......"

RESULTS OF THE "WEEKEND CHALLENGE"

The weekend challenge experienced during the entire period the power of the Holy Spirit. There were several achievements that were realized in the institution.

Some of them are;

- 1. Rededication of the institution/ Prayer Garden to God.
- 2. Salvation over 100 (hundred souls were born again that is 60 from the school and over 40 from other visiting schools.

- 3. Deliverance was experienced. 50 boys and girls of New Dawn were delivered from various bondages and over 100 from other 10 schools that joined the students on Sunday during the rally.
- 4. Discipleship class was started. The new converts that received the Lord during the weekend challenge started a discipleship class that will help then grow spiritually.
- 5. The School opened the door to other schools that brought students who met Jesus and their lives were transformed.
- 6. Boosting morale of the students during the time. There was one-on-one counseling with students who had lost hope, had low esteem and were performing poorly they received counseling from the team and they were left motivated and focused to achieve their dreams.
- 7. In filling of the Holy Spirit, the youths and students who desired the gift of the Holy Spirit were filled.

Praise the Lord! We are providing Pastor Anthony with funding to do more outreach activities and spiritual development with the New Dawn students.

<u>India</u>

Pastor Raj continues to share the gospel while also meeting the needs of his community. Recently they held an outreach to lepers. Here is his summary report

Today, the Lord allowed us to fulfill His commandment in **James 1:27**—to look after the afflicted and keep ourselves unstained by the world. We hosted a **powerful Leprosy Outreach Program** at our orphanage campus, where **25 precious souls** battling leprosy experienced God's tangible love through our ministry!

The Holy Spirit moved mightily as we:

✓ Provided nourishing meals, new clothing & hygiene kits *(meeting physical needs in Jesus' name)*

✓ Conducted **special health awareness sessions** with invited medical professionals who shared vital prevention/treatment knowledge *(for the body is God's temple - 1 Cor. 6:19)*

✓ Anointed prayer and Gospel sharing - many tears flowed as we declared **"by His stripes you ARE healed!" (Isaiah 53:5)**

✓ Presented each attendee with a Scripture-packed care package

Administrative Notes

I must apologize for the mail fiasco we had at the end of last year. We were out of state for a few months, and the US Post Office failed to forward some of our mail. They were never able to explain what happened. I am concerned that some of you may have given up on us. Please don't lose confidence. We are still here and WCO needs you.

After doing WCO's 990 tax form I can report we have less than 2% overhead which is for material supplies, some bookkeeping help, website hosting, and such. We have no employees. All of our travel expenses are self-funded. Essentially everything you give is transferred to one of our servant partners to be used in their ministry.

Regarding funding, the current New Dawn Kenya funding need is provided primarily by one donor given the urgency of the need. We hope to broaden this support. It currently costs about \$12,000/month for staffing, food, farming, utilities and all the other demands of boarding and educating 100 orphans. We hope to reduce this with our self-sufficiency efforts. Every contribution, small or large, will help bring new life to New Dawn.
